

A scarflette to wear upside-down, inside-out ... following your mood or the moment, by Pyogazel



Sizes:

One size fits all adults, can be made to fit a child.

Dimensions:

55 cm long, 11 cm wide, 14 cm wide at one end (due to the trim slightly 'ruffling') Note that the trim added about 2 cm length and 1 cm height

Difficulty:

advanced, the stitch used is a variation of the Tunisian Simple Stitch, the latter should be mastered before attempting this set. However, the whole set is still doable for daring beginners.

Materials:

Yarn: about 80g super bulky yarn (6 WPI) in beige.

Crochet hook: 8 mm Tunisian crochet hook (prefer a cabled one)

Others: 1cm Ø buttons or beads (4), 5mm wide ribbon (about 60 cm, optional)

About Tunisian Mesh Stitch:

This is the name this stitch was given in Annie's Attic 101 Easy Tunisian Stitches™. I re-discovered it while playing with back loops. This stitch is worked always in the bump at the back of the stitch from row below. It has more vertical stretch and is flatter than the Tunisian Simple Stitch, and with proper gauge, it loses its mesh effect.



Right side (loop drawn)



You will insert your hook here



Gauge:

Tunisian mesh stitch:

8 rows and 12 stitches

= 10 cm X 10 cm

Wrong side (hook inserted)



Right there



And draw a loop like this

Instructions

NB:

On forward row, worked from right to left, all the loops drawn are kept on the hook, they will be worked off on reverse row.

At the end of a reverse row, the loop that remains on the hook will be the right border stitch of next row. On the back, the first horizontal loop of the row must be worked and not skipped.

R0 - foundation chain: chain 50, turn,

R1 - draw a loop inserting the hook in the bump at the back of each foundation chain, keep all the loops on the hook (forward row complete), work off loops, that is to say:

Once you've drawn a loop from every stitch from row below, yarn over, pull through 1 loop on the hook, * yarn over, pull through 2 loops on the hook * repeat from * to * throughout (reverse row complete),

do not turn

R2 - draw a loop inserting the hook in the bump at the back of each stitch from row below, work off loops, do not turn

R3 - like R2

R4 – insert hook in the bump at the back of the first stitch from R3, draw a loop, yarn over, skip 1 stitch, draw a loop inserting the hook in the bump at the back of each remaining stitch from row below, work off loops, do not turn

R5 to **7** - like R2

R8 - like R4

R9 to 11 - like R2

At the end of R11, finish off, attach the yarn on the right side at the bottom of the right border of the garment.

R12 - * 3 single crochets worked in the same stitch, then1 single crochet in the 2 following stitches*, repeat from * to * on three sides of the scarflette. Finish off.

Finishing – Cut 2 pieces of ribbon 30cm long (or 2 strands of yarn) and use them to tie 2 beads or buttons on the right side.

Use the buttons to close the scarflette worn right side up, use the ribbons to tie her when worn inside out.

Chart: symbols

Work this way (forward) Insert hook in horizontal back border stitch (last loop 5 bump of stitch from row below remaining on hook) (reverse) and draw a loop Start here reverse row Yarn over Finish off 40 stitch Chain stitch Tunisian mesh stitch (1 R11 row completed stitch) slip stitch
